Members further suggested that over and above the curriculum framed by the INC, college may add more topics on basic soft skills in Vth and VIth Semesters.

As per revised regulations for B.Sc. Nursing 2020, the curriculum is distributed in four-year comprising of eight semesters that is credit and semester based.

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Curricular Framework

The B.Sc. Nursing program is a four-year program comprising of eight semesters that is credit and semester based. It is choice based only for elective courses. Competency based curriculum is the main approach that is based on ten core competencies. The courses are categorized into foundational courses, core courses and elective courses.

The curricular framework shown in the following table depicts the entire course curriculum, which is further outlined in the program structure.

The Dean of Dental College has requested to close the above course due to Lack of novelty in current scenario as it is included in the MDS curriculum.]

Involvement of international faculty and individual guidance to the students which will give students a global exposure.]

e) Certificate Course in Paediatric Endodontics and Post Endodontics Restorations.

[The Certificate Course in Pediatric Endodontics and Post Endodontics Restorations was approved by Board of Management vide its Resolutions No: BM-24(iv)-19 dated 30th July 2019. The Dean of Dental College has requested for to close the above course due to the course objectives are obsolete and not confirming with current trends of targeted stakeholders.]

Item No. BM-36(ii)-21: To consider PG Medical Education (Amendment) Regulations, 2020 of Board of Governors in Supersession of Medical Council of India published on 16th September, 2020 regarding District Residency Programme for PG students.

Resolution No. BM-36(ii)-21: After discussion it was resolved that the PG Medical Education (Amendment) Regulations, 2020 of Board of Governors in Supersession of Medical Council of India published on 16th September, 2020 regarding District Residency Programme for PG students of all MD/MS programmes, be implemented with effect from 16th September, 2020.

The Following are some of the important points of the said Regulations:

- 1. Postgraduate Medical Education (Amendment) Regulations 2020 in Clause 13 under the heading of 'Training and Responsibilities of District Residents' to be effective from 16th September, 2020.
- 2. Provided MD/MS students admitted with effect from academic session 2020-21, the training will be imparted as District Health System.
- 3. This shall be considered as training imparted in a Medical Institution.
- 4. All postgraduate students in broad specialities in all Medical Colleges/Institutions under the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 shall undergo a compulsory resident rotation of 3 months in District Hospital/District Health System.
- 5. District Health System as a part of the cause curriculum. This will be called DRP (District Residency Programme).
- 6. This rotation will be in 3rd or 4th or 5th semester of the PG Programme. Such students will be named as District Residents and they shall be under the overall guidance of the District Specialists and District Residency Programme Coordinator (DRPC). The clinical responsibilities will include OPD, IPD, Casualty, Night duties and other areas.
- 7. The programme is also applicable for Pre & Para Clinical Specialities. They will work in coordination with the District Health Officer/Chief Medical Officer.
- 8. They would be trained in the contribute to the diagnostic / laboratory's services, pharmacy services, forensic services, general clinical duties, managerial roles and public health programmes etc. as applicable. They may also be posted in research units/facilities, laboratories and filed sites of the Indian Council of Medical Research and other national research organizations.
- 9. The District Residents will get full stipend/salary from respective medial colleges, subject to the attendance record submitted by appropriate District Authorities to the parent medical college. On the completion of the duration of training the District Resident will receive a certification of satisfactory completion.
- 10. It will be the responsibility of all Medical College/Institutions to place the postgraduate students at the disposal of Govt. of concerned State for the District Residency Programme.
- 11. The faculty of the concerned department will provide guidance to the District Residents Programme by phone/e-communication.

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- 12. Each Medical College will set up a committee under the Academic Cell to coordinate and monitor implementation of District Residents Programme.
- 13. The Medical College may apply for proportionate enhancement of MD/MS seats to the Board of Governors of the MCI to compensate for the potential compromise of work at the teaching hospital due to out posting of postgraduate medical students.
- 14. The programme shall be coordinate jointly by the department / Directorate of Medical Education and the Department / Directorate of Health Services and an officer of the State/Union Territory Government shall be designated as the State/UT District Residency Programme Nodal Officer. The concerned Government shall be responsible for their facilitation oversight and supervision of the District Residency Programme.
- 15. The designated State/UT District Resident Programme Nodal Officer shall identify and designate hospitals that are suitable for such rotation in terms of availability of specific specialities, facilities and services available in consultation with the Directorate of Health Services of the State and the Medical Colleges and develop a placemen schedule of the Postgraduate residents of the medical colleges due for Rotation at least 6 months in advance. This official will also be responsible for grievance redressal at state level.
- 16. The state Government will provide suitable accommodation and transportation to workplace, security especially for lady residents.
- 17. In case all PG residents of a state cannot be an absorbed within their respective jurisdiction, they may be posted to other states in mutual understanding with the respective Governments.
- 18. The Board of Governors with MCI will constitute a National Steering Committee in consultation with the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India to oversee the implementation of the District Residency Programme.

PG Medical Education (Amendment) Regulations, 2020 of Board of Governors in Supersession of Medical Council of India published on 16th September, 2020 regarding **District Residency Programme for PG students** is enclosed as **Annexure – VI.**

Item No. BM-36(iii)-21: To consider changes in the Fellowship Programme in Advance Spine Surgery.

[Note: The Board of Management at its meeting held on 20th October, 2020 approved the starting of Fellowship Programme in Advance Spine Surgery in the Department of Neurosurgery. The Professor and Head, Dept. of Neurosurgery suggested changes in title of the Fellowship Programme and same were approved by the Board of Studies Faculty of Medicine and Academic Council.]
